VISIBLE LEARNING STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY

On the Staff Development Day last week, the teaching staff continued their Visible Learning journey with a group of schools across the Hawkesbury. The focuses so far have been 'Learning Intentions (WALT = We Are Learning To...) and Success Criteria' (WILF = What I'm Looking For...) as well as 'Effective Feedback' (feedback based on the LISC – Learning Intentions and Success Criteria – identifying what a student can do well and where they need to go next). The focus for Monday's session was 'Creating Assessments for Teaching and Learning'. The staff found the assessment examples, theory and tools provided, very valuable for future assessment implementation. Whilst the teachers were at Visible Learning training, our office and support staff attended CPR and First Aid training at Bilpin Public School.

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

The NCCD is an annual collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment due to disability and the level of reasonable adjustment they are receiving. The national data collection counts students who have been identified by a school team as receiving an adjustment to address a disability as defined under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (www.comlaw.gov.au). This information will help teachers, principals, education authorities and families to better support students with a disability to take part in school on the same basis as other students. 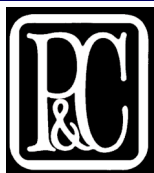
- Staffing - No change

Dear Parent / Carer,

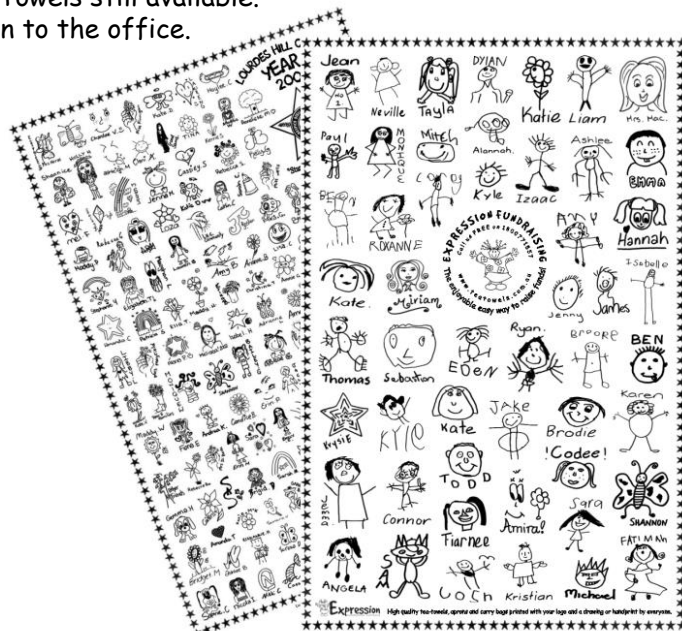
Once again this year the P&C committee is running the popular group tea towel project to help raise funds for our Spring Fair.

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Changes to the enrolment policy come into effect in Term 3 2019

Existing enrolments are not affected

The Enrolment of Students in NSW Government Schools policy is in place to assist schools meet their obligations under the Education Act 1990.

It outlines procedures to ensure that schools uphold the NSW Department of Education's core values of equity, accountability and integrity in the enrolment process.

A review was necessary to support the department's responsibility to ensure that resources are effectively and equitably used across our schools.

About the revised policy

The revised policy is designed to support schools to better manage non-local enrolment applications.

It is primarily a consolidation of enrolment instructions in several memoranda and supplementary web documents circulated to schools over a number of years.

It is important to note that students are entitled to be enrolled at their local school, whether or not the school is at capacity.

What are the changes?

The enrolment cap

The enrolment cap is the number of students that can be enrolled at a school based on permanent accommodation. The cap is set centrally and replaces enrolment ceilings currently in use.

The enrolment cap does not apply to preschool classes or schools without designated intake areas, for example selective schools.

The local enrolment buffer

Within the enrolment cap, a number of enrolment places (the buffer) must be set aside for the enrolment of local students arriving throughout the year.

The local enrolment buffer will vary based on school profile and previous enrolment patterns. This means that schools with high fluctuations in enrolment may set a larger buffer than schools where mid-year enrolments are low. Once a school has reached their local enrolment buffer places cannot be offered to non-local students.

The school's local enrolment buffer, along with the school's non-local enrolment criteria, is to be reviewed on a regular basis. Any change is to be approved by the Director, Educational Leadership in time for enrolment of the following year's intake.

100-point residential address check

Schools at or near their local enrolment buffer or above their enrolment cap must undertake the prescribed 100-point check to verify that the student presenting for enrolment resides within the school's designated intake area.

In exceptional circumstances, the principal may waive this requirement subject to approval by the Director, Educational Leadership.

Contacting the principal of the child's local school

In schools that are near their local enrolment buffer, principals in receipt of an application for a non-local enrolment will inform the principal of the student's local school and seek the approval of the Director, Educational Leadership before enrolling the child.

Criteria for non-local enrolment

The revised policy clarifies that criteria for non-local enrolments will not include student ability, performance or achievement.

For schools under their cap and buffer priority should be given to siblings of currently enrolled students, where possible.

Local status due to boundary change

From time to time changes to a local intake area might result in a family with a child/children currently enrolled and in attendance at the school as local students consequently residing outside the local intake area. These families will retain the entitlement to enrol siblings together at the school, regardless of whether the school is over the buffer or cap.

Where a local student has moved residential address following initial enrolment, or was enrolled as a non-local student, the family does not have an entitlement to enrol siblings at the school. Criteria for non-local enrolment as determined by the school would apply to siblings.

Non-local enrolment panels

There is no change in the requirement for the formation of non-local enrolment panels. A panel needs to be formed to consider non-local enrolment applications when number of non-local applications received exceeds the number of places available below the local enrolment buffer level.

Schools that are above their buffer level cannot enrol non-local students, and therefore have no need to form a non-local enrolment panel.

Schools that can accommodate the non-local enrolment applications received without exceeding their buffer level should process the enrolments without forming a panel.

Transition to the revised policy

All schools will be supported by their Director, Educational Leadership to meet the new requirements.

From Term 2 Week 8, Directors, Educational Leadership will notify schools of their calculated enrolment cap and work with all principals in their network to support the transition to the revised policy.

Principals will work with the Director, Educational Leadership to:

1. meet with their Director, Educational Leadership to set a local enrolment buffer
2. ensure that relevant staff know their school's cap, and whether they can or cannot accept non-local enrolments
3. review and publish non-local selection procedures if nearing or over the buffer
4. for schools over the cap, meet with their Director, Educational Leadership to establish a plan for managing the school's enrolment numbers.

Enrolment caps will apply from Term 4 Week 1.

For schools that are above their enrolment cap

There are many reasons why a school is over their enrolment cap. This may be due to historical factors, or increasing demand from local enrolment.

It is important to note that schools can be over their enrolment cap but still be complying with the requirements of the enrolment policy.

To comply with the policy, schools that are over the cap:

- must not accept any mainstream non-local enrolments unless required by the Director, Educational Leadership.
- must use the prescribed 100-point residential address check to ensure that students being presented for enrolment reside within the designated intake area.
